THE MINIMUM WAGE

From April 2020, the national minimum wage is £4.55 per hour for Under 18s, £6.45 per hour for 18-20 year olds, £8.20 per hour for 21 to 24 year olds and £8.72 per hour at 25 years and over. More information is available at: gov.uk/national-minimum-wage-rates
