If you provide care, assistance or support to another family member on an unpaid basis, you could be an Adult Carer.

This may include caring for a relative who is disabled, has a chronic illness, mental health problem or other condition and who ordinarily would not be able to cope without support or supervision.

Support while you study

You'll have access to a post-entry contact who can provide advice and signpost you to further information and services across the university. studentsuccess@cumbria.ac.uk

Entry package includes:

- Access to a friendly University Life Mentor - a current student at the university.
- Information about discretionary financial support you may be able to access once at the university.
- If required, help accessing support with managing your academic commitments, including support with submission of extenuating circumstances.
