#### A brief summary of activity from UoC- Institute of Education:

#### 1) Reminder- Teaching Vacancies (DfE) collaborative information update:

The Institute of Education have recently been working closely with DfE to improve communication channels about Cumbrian schools expertise and teacher recruitment/ supply.

Teaching vacancies is an excellent FREE service (We will send promotional videos and flyers). The link for the website is <u>https://teaching-vacancies.service.gov.uk/</u>. For Schools/settings:

- **Teaching Vacancies is a free job search and listings service** that makes it easy to find and fill teaching roles in schools across England.
- It is simple, easy to use and totally free. Schools can advertise a vacancy as many times as they like and allows them to save their money for use in the classroom, rather than on paying private providers to advertise vacancies.
- 60% of all schools are already using Teaching Vacancies, posting over 13,000 jobs between them so far and saving schools between £50-75m on teacher recruitment every year.

## 3. Initial Teacher Training (Education) Inspection Framework

The draft new Ofsted ITE Inspection Framework is due to be published on 27<sup>th</sup> January. There will be a 10 week consultation period and we intend to attend consultation events and send our Partnership's comments and feedback to Ofsted re the draft framework. The final framework, handbook and guidance will be published in April with the first inspections taking place in late January 2021.

Likely to match EIF with a strong focus on knowledge acquisition and curriculum design. We also note that early indications predict that the 'grading' (Numerical) of training teachers will take much changed emphasis during inspections. Teams will want to be assured that providers are rigorous in producing good teachers but outcomes will be driven by 'have they met requirements of the teacher standards'. To this end we ask that you please engage with The NW ITE provider's survey on how you feel training teachers should be 'graded/or not' at ....

November 2019 saw the release of 'The initial teacher training (ITT) core content framework' which defines in detail the minimum entitlement of all trainee teachers. Drawing on the best available evidence, it sets out the content that ITT providers and their partnerships must draw upon when designing and delivering their ITT programmes.

The ITT core content framework aligns with the <u>Early Career Framework</u> to establish an entitlement to a 3 or more year structured package of support for all new teachers at the start of their careers.

Well worth a read- especially as it now explicitly links training with the new 2yr requirement to support NQT CPD.
