<b>Stationery</b>	
<p><b>EXAMPLE:</b> Stationery for your own personal use (pens, papers and folders, etc.).</p> <p>Whilst you will choose how much you need, expect to pay around £30 - £40 per year for these.</p>	
<b>Clothing and Equipment</b>	
<p>Students will incur costs for stationery and printing and other basic materials whilst on course and should budget accordingly. Where specifics are required they will be detailed below but items denoted are an outline rather than indicative list. Stationery for your own personal use (pens, papers and folders, etc.) Whilst you will choose how much you need, expect to pay around £10 - £20 per year for these.</p>	
<b>Personal Equipment (Essential)</b>	
<p>A Scientific Calculator may be helpful for the research methods classes. The costs vary but they typically fall within the £8-15 range. Stationery to include folders, paper, dividers, wallets, notebooks and pens (approximate costs £30 per annum) An academic diary (approximate cost between £5- £10 per annum) A pen drive or other storage device may be useful to back up your work. (approximate cost around £15)</p>
