<b>Additional Costs</b>	
<p>All students need to be aware that they will incur additional costs whilst on programme. The list below will provide you with an overview of additional costs.</p> <p>Books are reviewed annually and are therefore subject to change, course welcome information will provide you with an indicative list for the year.</p>	
<b>Books and Journals</b>	
<p>Various titles are recommended for the course, but with a comprehensive library and online resources mandatory purchase is not required only advised. A budget of £45 per year would suffice for recommended texts.</p>	
<b>Stationery</b>	
<p>Students will incur costs for stationery and printing and other basic materials whilst on course and should budget accordingly. Where specifics are required they will be detailed below but items denoted are an outline rather than indicative list.</p>	
<b>Clothing and Equipment</b>	
<p>Students may require access to a laptop due to the remote nature of many media projects. Along with relevant media editing software packages. There are a number of limited laptops available from AV stores for limited periods and extensive computer suites on campus, however most students find a laptop and software of their own more convenient. Below is the equipment you would be expected to own or purchase. We do have equipment that can be loaned initially, so there is no rush to buy straight away, and in many cases if you're not sure, wait until you arrive and we can advise you more directly. • Waterproof jacket and trousers (£50 - £150) • Walking boots (£50-120) • Warm hat and gloves (£30) • Other outdoor clothing e.g. thermals, fleeces, socks, walking type trousers etc. (varies) • Rucksack for day use (approx. 40 litres). You may also find a larger rucksack useful for longer trips. • Water bottle/flask (£5-10) • Compass (e.g. Silva expedition type 4) (£20) • Whistle (e.g. orange plastic one) (£1.50) • Orange survival bag or equivalent (£5) As for media equipment, expect to be purchasing a DSLR camera within the first year. However, we have enough to loan to you, so no hurry. It is better to try ours out, get advice, and then buy wisely. It is anticipated that students may need to invest in their own productions, this may include travel costs, the purchase production materials or the assistance of professional actors to present, or produce a voice over in the films. Expect to spend c.£150 per year on such expenses.</p>	
<b>Field Trips</b>	
<p>On certain field trips an option to stay overnight might be offered. An example would be a practical where due to distance travelled staying overnight might be preferable to long road trips, costs are commonly less than £20 for the night and will be optional. Extra-curricular trips and courses are offered throughout the course of study. These can range from local trips starting at £10 to international trips costing over £1000. These are all optional and depend upon staff and student interests. During welcome week, first years have the opportunity to attend a number of activities (non SU) with a combined cost of approx. £15, attendance is optional.</p>
