Stationery	
<p>Stationery for your own personal use (pens, papers and folders, etc.).</p> <p>Whilst you will choose how much you need, expect to pay around £30 - £40 per year for these.</p> <p>Students may wish to print course/module resources; this may be approximately 25 – 50 pounds per year.</p>	
Clothing and Equipment	

Students should budget approximately £200 - £300 for specialist clothing and equipment.

For university sessions in the classroom: Students are required to wear sensible, comfortable clothes for classroom sessions (not uniform)

For university sessions in the clinical skills laboratories: students are required to wear full uniform

Uniform tunics and trousers are not additional costs as they are provided by the University. However, students will require the following:

- Plain black socks
- Plain black cardigans
- Plain, black, flat shoes
- A fob watch for clinical practice

In addition, students should budget approximately 120-150 pounds per year for uniform laundering.

Field Trips

You may have the opportunity to go on a national or international placement outside of our partner NHS Trusts, either as part of your studies or in addition. The cost for the trips vary enormously and range from 500 upwards depending on where you choose to stay and travel to (these are not organised through the university, but are organised by the student, although risk assessments are undertaken through the university). These trips are optional.

You may wish to attend conferences (optional not part of the course) again the costs vary and depend on whether you go to a one day or several day event, the costs will vary depending on where the venues are and the cost of accommodation you choose. With conference fees, travel and accommodation you will need to budget from anywhere between £250 and £750 per conference.
