- In October 2011, the council awarded a new countywide contract to VNC Lifeline
- Establish Telecare as a core service offer
- Increase numbers of users

Telecare

- Pendants to call for help
- Sensors to detect and manage risks
- 24/7 remote monitoring
- Physical response if needed





Safe walking

- Trial of Everon Vega
- Uses GPS technology
- Directs responders to wearer's location
- Call for help
- Safe zone
- Hands free phone





Stand alone assistive technology

- Trial of EasyLink equipment
- No monitoring simple pager alerts a carer to a risk
- Bed, chair, door and motion sensors available





Meeting needs

- Falls risk
- Living with Dementia
- Home safety risks
 - Smoke, fire, flood, natural gas, carbon monoxide
 - Extremes of heat and cold, bogus callers
- Supporting carers



Independent alarms services

- Self funders
- Mainly community alarms – some Telecare sensors provided
- Provide physical response services in some parts of the county





New contract for Telecare and Assistive Technology

- Awarded to Welbeing October 2016
- 3 + 1 years
- Increase numbers of users
- Source equipment
- Reduced costs





New contract for Telecare and Assistive Technology

- Information and advice service – self funders
- Subcontract with Eden Housing Association
- Wider range of equipment available

 - Monitored Telecare
 - Safe walking GPS devices
 - Limited range of stand alone AT
- Approval process to add new equipment and services to the list
