

Cumbria International Undergraduate Scholarship

Terms and Conditions

These terms and conditions apply to the Cumbria International Undergraduate Scholarship offered at University of Cumbria only.

Summary

- Total value of Cumbria International Undergraduate Scholarship: £4,500
 - Annual award of £1,500 payable each year for three-year degree
- Deadline for all conditions to be met: 5th August 2026 (5th December 2026 for programme starting in January 2027)
- Deadline for relevant deposits to be paid: 5th August 2026 (5th December 2026 for programme starting in January 2027)
- Scholarships will be automatically deducted from the tuition fees on registration at the University of Cumbria
- There is no cash alternative for the award.
- This award cannot be held in conjunction with any other university awards or discounts
- The university retains the right to withdraw this scholarship, at any time prior to 5th August 2026

Eligible Undergraduate programmes

International applicants holding an offer for the following undergraduate programmes **may be eligible** for the Cumbria International UG Scholarship:

- Any bachelor's programme delivered full-time in person on the Ambleside Campus
- Any bachelor's programme delivered full-time in person on the Carlisle Campus (both Brampton Road and Fusehill Street)
- Any bachelor's programme delivered full-time in person on the Lancaster Campus

The following undergraduate programmes **are not eligible** for the Cumbria International Undergraduate Scholarship:

- Undergraduate Pre-Registration Health Courses
- All UG programmes delivered by distance or blended learning
- All UG programmes delivered in collaboration with an educational partner
- Programmes delivered within the International College

Note:

- Students applying for a bachelor's degree with a placement year may be eligible for the International Undergraduate Scholarship, however, it must be noted that the award is not payable during the placement year.
- Students progressing onto undergraduate programmes at University of Cumbria, from the International College, will be considered eligible for the International Undergraduate Scholarship providing all eligibility criteria have been met.

Other Eligibility Criteria

1. To be eligible for the Cumbria International UG Scholarship, applicants must hold an offer of a place of study on an **eligible full-time bachelor's programme** (minimum 360 credits) at Ambleside, Carlisle (Brampton Road), Carlisle (Fusehill Street) or Lancaster Campus.
2. Only applicants with an offer of a place in September 2026 or January 2027 will be considered for the award.
3. For students enrolling on programmes lasting more than one year the scholarship is awarded **each year of the programme** as a fee reduction (maximum 3 years of study).
4. All applicants must be self-funding students with **overseas fee status**.

5. Only offer holders with, or on track to be awarded, the minimum required academic qualifications will be considered for an award

Applying for the International UG Scholarship

- There is no need to apply for this scholarship, if the applicant is eligible, the award will be automatically applied to reduce the tuition fee payable.

Eligible award holders

1. Scholarships can only be taken during the 2026/27 academic year and cannot be deferred to any other period
2. Scholarships will not be awarded to applicants in receipt of a scholarship from any other source.
3. Published tuition fees apply to the stated academic year only and may be subject to inflationary increases in subsequent years of study.
4. This scholarship cannot be combined with any other scholarship or discount and, if a successful applicant is offered more than one University of Cumbria award, only the award of the greater amount will be granted.
5. Should a successful candidate transfer programme, the scholarship may no longer be valid and may be withdrawn.
6. Should a successful candidate withdraw/suspend from a programme of study the student will be liable to pay tuition fees in accordance with the university's tuition fee policy.
7. All successful scholarship holders will be invited to support the university with appropriate internationalisation events and provide a photograph and statement to be included in our publicity.
8. The University of Cumbria retains the right to withdraw the scholarship in the following circumstances:
 - a. It is subsequently found that the candidate is ineligible for the scholarship, for example if the candidate has not met the entry requirements or the terms and conditions of this award.
 - b. Documentation used to apply to a programme at the university are subsequently found to be fraudulent.
 - c. Tuition fees are not paid in accordance with the terms and conditions of this award and/or the university's tuition fee policy.
 - d. The university suspends or withdraws an eligible programme of study for 2026/27 entry
